

Sacramental Information




Baptism: Please call the church office for appointment at least two months prior to date. A prep class is required. Parents should contact Dcn Pouncy. **RCIA:** Adults Seeking Baptism and/or Making a Profession in the Catholic Christian Faith should contact Deacon Greg Shumpert.

Marriage: Please contact the parish office before setting your date. The Church asks that couples be parish members for at least 6 months before setting a date. Participation in Pre-Cana and a Premarital Inventory required.

Funerals: Please contact the parish office before going to see a Funeral Director. We will accommodate the needs of your family to help you through the loss and healing.

Ministry to Sick and Shut-In/ Anointing of the Sick/ Home Visitation/Receiving Communion at Home: If you or a loved one is in need of a minister from St. Agatha-St. Martin de Porres to visit for Communion, Anointing of the Sick or any other pastoral need, please contact the church office as soon as the need arises. From the Desk of Fr. Larry...

My friends, we struggle with loneliness, especially after the departure or death of a loved one. Inside we struggle with, "What do I do now that this person is gone?" The disciples of Jesus must have had those similar feelings. First, after Jesus' death when they thought all had been lost. Then, having the Resurrected Lord appear to them a few times, Him now leaving them and ascending to the Father in heaven, to return to the 'place' from which the Father had sent him.

So what do they do now? Jesus tells them to wait because He will be sending the Holy Spirit to dwell within them and among them. They were to be, as it says in this Sundays reading from Ephesians, filled with all humility and gentleness, bearing with one another through love, striving to preserve the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace: one body and one Spirit. (Eph 4:2-5)

In many ways, Jesus' physically leaving the disciples opens the door for them now to be fully themselves because they, as all of us are, are gifted with the Holy Spirit dwelling within them, seeking to support, encourage and stretch them to 'go forth' and be bearers of the Good News to the ends of the earth.

We might imagine them going back to the Upper Room where they had celebrated the Last Supper with Jesus, waiting, wondering, a mix of excitement and fear. When would the Spirit come?

As I often remind those who have lost loved ones, they now need to adjust to a new reality. Physical separation, from our Christian belief, does not mean a spiritual separation. In fact, we believe that our loved ones, now dwelling in the heart of God, bring us closer to God through their intercession, their spirit very much alive, still connected to us and connected to the heart of Jesus, the Father and their Holy Spirit.

I love the theological term often used in referring to Jesus' Ascension: the Generous Absence of Jesus. Sounds strange, doesn't it? Yet what it says to us is, now that Jesus and our loved ones are physically gone from us, it is now time for us to step up and continue their legacy of love in the world, each in our own unique, God-given way. The Generous Absence of Jesus offers us two alternatives: continue to mourn the physical loss of our loved ones or recognize this as an opportunity to reflect on our own lives and how we will continue to live our lives humbly, lovingly and generously. The Generous Absence of Jesus and our loved ones, always, always supported by the Gift of Jesus and the Father: their Sweet Holy Spirit!

After all, Jesus is still physically and spiritually present to us in the Eucharist, offering Himself to us to feed us for the journey. In Holy Communion, we take his body and blood into our body and blood. The Spirit helps us accept his whole life, death, and resurrection as these settle into us and into others around us. This real presence now abides forever in our midst, urging us, gently nudging us to say yes. Gentle Peace! Fr. Larry
