

From the Desk of Fr. Larry...

My friends, more and more I realize that faith and trust are openings that allow God's love to come into us. God cares enough about us to allow pain and sorrow to find us and to stretch us and to open doors to a deeper relation with him. God does not cause the pain and sorrow but allows it. And lets it stretch us.

This is the theme of our Scripture readings today. In the first reading, God recounts to the despairing Job that God's love has always been there for him. "Who shut within doors the sea, when it burst forth from the womb; when I made the clouds its garment and thick darkness its swaddling bands? When I set limits for it and fastened the bar of its door, and said: Thus far shall you come but no farther, and here shall your proud waves be stilled! Job 38: 8-11 I love the maternal language God uses, the seas, water, the source of life being birthed from God's womb. God sets limits on where the sea will be allowed to encroach. God commands the elements, yet God will not command the human spirit to follow Him. God wants our commitment, out of love, to accept God's constant and lifegiving invitation to partner with Him in the creation of a better world for all.

This requires real faith and trust, especially in the midst of the storms of life, where we are being tested in the depth of our faith in God that God will get us through and, in the process, make us even stronger.

The Gospel gives a similar account, again involving an unruly sea and the despair of Jesus' disciples, even as he rests close by in the stern of the boat. Out of fear, they are collectively compelled to cry out to him and wake him to demand he save them.

I wonder if any of them initially trusted that Jesus would not let them drown, but then bought into the fear of the others and got caught up in the group panic? This may be a good lesson for our unifying parish: Do we buy into the fear that our 'boat' will eventually capsize, OR do we trust in God strongly enough to allay our fears and the fears of others that, unabated, would eventually lead to the sinking of the 'boat.'

I love it that Jesus can command demons and nature, but gives us free will to choose ourselves whether we will trust and follow His commands, having faith that God's only desire is to help us become our very best selves, our very best reflection of the Spirit of God that breathed us into this life and the possibility of eternal life.

So where is your faith these days? Do you believe that God loves you totally and unquestionably, that Your being conceived and born into this world out of Love is an incredible gift to You and others? Do you, in the midst of hardship, trust that God will get you through, that God will never allow any hardship that you, with the help of God and God's people, cannot handle? Life is not all smooth sailing. We can appreciate the light wind that propels us through life. Can we also appreciate that sometimes it takes storms to move us as well?
