We Are Created for a Purpose

Creation in the Book of Genesis

The Book of Genesis 1:26-28 narrates the story of the creation of humankind as follows:

26 Then God said, "Let us make mankind in our image, in our likeness, so that they may rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky, over the livestock and all the wild animals, and over all the creatures that move along the ground." 27 So God created mankind in his own image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them. 28 God blessed them and said to them, "Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth and subdue it. Rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky and over every living creature that moves on the ground."

Created as Unique Beings

Out of love, God created us in His image and likeness here on Earth. Each of us is an unrepeatable instance of God's love. There is, and will never be, anyone else like you. You are unique, special, and loved by God.

Why We Were Created

- To Reflect God's Image: The Bible tells us that God created humankind in His own image and likeness. In other words, we are the reflection of God on Earth. You are meant to embody His attributes and radiate His presence in the world.
- To Be Blessed and Be a Blessing to Others: When God created us, He blessed us. Each of us is inherently blessed by God, therefore, making us a blessing from Him to others. We are sanctified people called to embody the goodness of God. In God's eyes, we are His beloved people, even when we feel unworthy.
- To Be Fruitful and Productive: God instructed us to be fruitful, multiply, and rule over the world. This is more than a call to inhabit the earth; it is a call to grow, be productive, and govern it responsibly. God wanted us to be the salt, the light, and the fire of the world by loving Him, knowing Him, and serving Him, His people, and His creation. We are called to make a positive impact in the world and inspire change.

Catherine of Siena

St. Catherine of Siena was called at an early age to devote her life to God. At the age of 16, she chose to dedicate her life to serving God and later committed herself to serving her neighbors. She regularly visited prisoners, urging them to repent; cared for the sick, provided food and clothing, and even took on the task of burying the dead. St. Catherine is remembered for saying, "If you are what you were meant to be, you will set the world on fire." Her life exemplifies the profound impact one person can have when they live their lives according to God's purpose.

Therefore, every day, strive to be what you are meant to be to reflect God's image, embrace His blessings, and be a positive force in the world. As St. Catherine of Siena reminds us, living out our purpose has the power to ignite the world around us.

SERMON: THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (CYCLE B)

The themes of Advent are celebrated in the liturgy for several weeks beforehand, in the month of November. That is why the Leaflet Missal prayer book includes both November and December in one issue, because these Sundays really are very much on the same theme: the end of time, the Second Coming, the end of the world. The songs of Advent are appropriate all during November, from All Saints Day on.

• Today we hear Scripture readings that are indeed about the end of time. The Book of Daniel says that the dead will rise, that the just will shine like stars, that the wise will live forever. That prophecy of Daniel was given in the midst of suffering, of persecution, of terrible misfortune. It was said that Michael, the great prince, will come to do battle. Michael is a warrior, a soldier of the Lord. Gabriel blows the trumpet and announces the end of the world. Raphael is a messenger, who brings the judgment of God. But Michael is the one who fights for us, the one who helps bring the victory. In a time unsurpassed in distress, in a time of greatest struggle, in a time of worry unbounded, the victory will be ours. We will fight, and we shall overcome.

• Like Michael, Jesus Christ fights for us. His sacrifice is already complete, and he has won the battle. Scripture says that Jesus Christ offered one sacrifice for sins. The Epistle to the Hebrews teaches us that Christ has forever perfected those who are sanctified. Forever. Finally. Fully. Once sins have been forgiven, there is no further offering for sin.

• In other words, the Mass is not a new offering, a new sacrifice, in addition to that of Christ. His work is complete and sufficient and final. The battle is already won. In this understanding, the Mass is not so much a "re-presentation" or a re-enactment of the Cross. No, the Mass is, rather, a "representation" of the Cross. Meaningful to the end of time, the sacrifice of Christ represents the mystery of faith to us; in a powerful and real way, we share in that mystery.

This does not mean that Christ dies again or that Christ is offered again or that a new, distinct sacrifice takes place. This does mean that we are given the oppurtunity to offer ourselves with him and through him, to make the same sacrifice he did, to give God thanks and praise and glory, no matter what may come.

Praise God in glory, join all saints in white. Hear their splendid story; see the angels' light. God's one Church, perfected, stands before his throne.

Jesus, resurrected, comes to greet his own. Praise God in glory: Christ our Lord has come. Sound the royal trumpet! Sing and beat the drum!
